With a new year come new beginnings. This is definitely true this year at Peace High with High School Redesign. We began this year introducing our Success teachers and Success blocks, where students were all assigned to a teacher similar to a homeroom. These groups included students in all grades, and they will stay the same all year. The Success teacher has a copy of each student's schedule, and checks in with the students in order to make sure that they are doing ok.

The Success blocks are 55 minutes every day, in the morning between A and B block on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and then in the afternoon between C and D blocks on Tuesday and Thursday. In these blocks students are able to have some choice in what they are in need of working on or getting help.

Teachers are offering things such as scheduled tutorials, open work rooms, extra credit projects, meetings or also scheduling time to meet as a Professional Learning Community with other staff members. What this is providing for the students is time that is flexible as to their individual learning needs and designed to help make them more successful in all classes. This is also providing some student accountability as they have to digitally sign in each day with a Google Form, and view the schedule of availability online on a Google Doc.

It has been an exciting start, and we look forward to more positive updates throughout the year.






Success Coach

Every Child Counts!!! No matter how old your child is or what grade they are attending (this applies to our teens just as much as it applies to our little ones), here are some helpful ...

...ways you can continue to help your child succeed at school...

- ✓ Have a routine and stick to it - regular times for bedtimes, homework, and regular meals are important for us all!
- ✓ Communicate regularly with your child's teachers, not just at report card times - make telephone calls, send emails, and visit the school!
- ✓ Find ways to get your child to read for pleasure at least 3 hours per week - magazines, books, comics, even shopping catalogues make great reading options!
- ✓ Encourage your child to feel connected with the school through involvement in extra-curricular activities/groups - the more we feel we belong to something, the more confident we feel about ourselves!
- ✓ Make sure your child eats a good breakfast and brings a healthy lunch every day - our bodies need regular fuelling to run properly!

What's New?

The Be Your own Boss or **“BYOB” Program** will be offered by Peace River High School staff, Project PEACE staff and other partners from within social and health service agencies in the community. The program is a self-management and resiliency skills building program offered in a supportive group setting. It is set up for adolescents living with chronic health conditions, across all of the aspects that make up “health” - physical, mental and social/emotional.

The **Fourth R Plus “Healthy Relationships”** program will be incorporated into Grade 9 Health Classes through Project PEACE Success Coaches working with classroom teachers to facilitate learning. The Fourth R sessions uses interactive learning to teach skills to promote safer decision-making with peers and dating partners. The program focusses on relationship issues and pressures in early adolescence and targets health promotion through making use of youths' interest in learning about lifestyle issues.
