DO NOT FORGET TO APPLY FOR THE SUPERINTENDENT AWARD!!

DEADLINE: JUNE 26

Did you know that your student's hard work can be rewarded in the form of cash??!

The Peace River School Division created the Superintendent Award to encourage students to take more classes during their high school years and to provide an opportunity for scholarships to students who may not meet the academic level for other scholarships but still demonstrate a strong work ethic and character. The scholarship is paid directly to the student in October after their graduating year.

How much could be earned??

The Superintendent's Award is based on the total number of credits earned in a maximum of seven semesters. Scholarships will be awarded based on the following grid:

120 - 129 credits = \$500

130 – 139 credits = \$750

140 + credits = \$1000

What are the eligibility criteria??

A student must meet the Alberta Education Diploma Requirements, achieve a minimum of 120 credits with a 60% minimum average and complete at least 4 semesters (including their senior year) in Peace River School Division.

What is the application process??

Grade 12 students must provide a properly formatted cover letter and graduation picture to the principal by June 26, 2013. Please see Mr. Pobuda for all the details!






Celebrating Education Week



Athletics


The Athletic Season for the 2012-2013 season is drawing to a close. Great work to all of the student-athletes and to the coaches for their successful seasons!


